The Good Samaritan Society (GSS) and Good Samaritan Canada (GSC) are leading faith-based, not-for-profit, registered charities in Western Canada that provide quality accommodations, health, and community care services and programs.

Our organization has developed and implemented innovations in care and housing and provides support and services to help all residents feel at home and become an integral part of the local neighbourhood.

The entire community benefits from the unique contributions and interests of those who reside, work, volunteer, and visit the building. Together, our goal is to create a friendly, home-like community.



Complex Care

Good Samaritan Christenson Village includes 50 licensed complex care rooms, each with a bathroom and wheelchair accessible shower. Good Samaritan Canada will provide a bed, night table, dresser and side chair. Residents are encouraged to bring some of their own belongings, such as a chair, lamp, pictures, quilt or bedspread, to personalize their room. The residential program is intended for residents that can no longer be supported independently in the community and require 24 hour professional care.

Dementia Care

Each of the three cottages is a unique duplex designed to create a home-like setting for ten residents. Each half of the duplex has five bedrooms, living room with fireplace, kitchen, and secure access to a fenced yard. Clients are included in the events of daily living to the extent that they are accustomed and able. The cottage design and care programs are specific for residents with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia. The secure and supportive environment is "more like home" and provides the security and safety these residents require.



Assisted Living

Assisted Living programs are intended for residents that can no longer live independently in the community. The assisted living program at Good Samaritan Christenson Village consists of 60 one-bedroom suites. The program offers residents the flexibility to prepare breakfast and lunch in their own suite, if they choose. Residents pay rent, which includes two daily meals, housekeeping, linen service, and TeleCare® (an emergency response service). Optional services include a third meal, and personal laundry service.

Who is Eligible?

Admission to our residency program is through the Vancouver Coastal Health Regions Community Services. The program is intended for residents of Gibsons and the surrounding communities that can no longer live in their own home or community location and require 24-hour care/support. All beds at the site meet the licensing and registration requirements of the province of British Columbia. Residents wishing to be considered for this program should discuss this option with Vancouver Coastal Health Region.
