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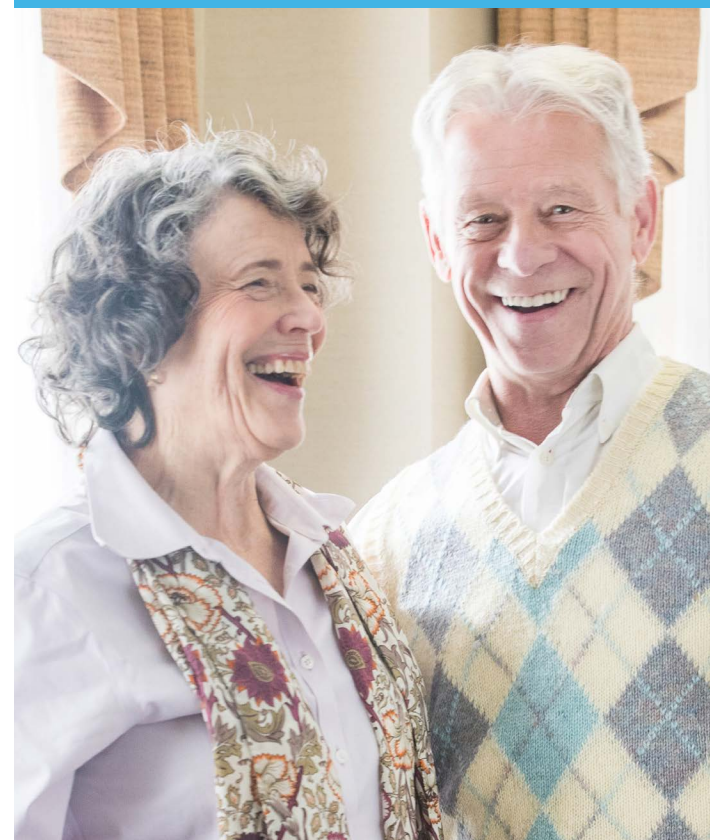

The Good Samaritan Society (GSS) and Good Samaritan Canada (GSC) are leading faith-based, not-for-profit, registered charities in Western Canada that provide quality accommodations, health, and community care services and programs.

Our organization has developed innovations in care and housing that provide support to help residents feel at home and become an integral part of the local neighbourhood.

The entire community benefits from the unique contributions and interests of those who reside, work, volunteer, and visit the building. Together, our goal is to create a friendly, home-like community.



Supportive Living

The Designated Supportive Living Program at the Good Samaritan Garden Vista consists of 25 studio units. The program offers residents the flexibility to prepare breakfast and lunch in their own suite, if they choose. Residents furnish and personalize their suite with their own belongings. Residents pay rent, which includes a daily evening meal, housekeeping and linen service, and TeleCare® (an emergency response service). Health care is funded by Alberta Health Services.

Optional services include breakfast, lunch, and personal laundry service.

To qualify for admission to the Designated Supportive Living Program, residents are first assessed by the Alberta Health Services Access Centre 403-388-6380.



Dementia Care

There are 10 dementia care beds at Good Samaritan Garden Vista. This unit is designed to create a home-like setting for 10 clients living with dementia. This unit has a common living room with fireplace, TV room, kitchen and dining room. Residents have their own private room with bathroom. The bathroom has a sink, toilet and ensuite shower. Residents are included in the events of daily living to the extent that they are accustomed and able. Admission is coordinated through the Alberta Health Services Access Centre, 403-388-6380.
