## Supportive Living

Good Samaritan Wedman House offers a total of 30 private Supportive Living studio suites. The Supportive Living program promotes privacy, dignity, independence, individuality and freedom of choice. Residents furnish and personalize their suite with their own belongings. Residents pay an accommodation fee which includes three meals plus snacks, housekeeping and linen service, and Good Samaritan TeleCare® (a 24-hour emergency response service). There is also the option of personal laundry service.

The program offers flexible 24-hour on-site personal care with access to professional services, such as registered nursing, physical therapy and occupational therapy.

## Dementia/Alzheimer Care Cottages

Good Samaritan Wedman Village consists of three, 10-bed secure dementia/Alzheimer care cottages. Our cottages are unique duplexes designed to create a homelike setting for up to 10 residents with dementia/Alzheimer in each cottage. Each side of the duplex has five bedrooms, a living room with fireplace, kitchen, and access to a secure fenced yard.

A Community Care Nurse will assess persons seeking admission to the dementia care cottage at Good Samaritan Wedman Village. All assessments are reviewed and prioritized by AHS. For more information on how to qualify for admission, contact AHS at 780-496-1300.

## Pre-Admission Visits

Once assessed as requiring a supportive living level of care, we encourage all prospective residents and their immediate family members to visit Good Samaritan Wedman House & Wedman Village Homes prior to admission. The visit allows for an exchange of information and discussions regarding expectations on the part of the resident, family and the staff at the care facility.
