Dear Residents and Loved Ones of Good Samaritan Clearwater Centre,

I wanted to provide you with an update regarding the COVID-19 outbreak at Good Samaritan Clearwater Centre. Since my last letter to you on October 29, we have not identified any additional cases of COVID-19. As a result of having no active cases of COVID-19 within the last 14 days in the supportive living program, public health has declared the outbreak over within supportive living only. However, the following precautions must remain in place as directed by the Medical Officer of Health:

- Group activities continue to be on hold at this time.
- Supportive Living residents can have up to 4 designated support persons visit.
- Social visits continue to be on hold at this time.
- Personal services such as hairdressing are allowed however the resident and the person providing the service must be masked and only one resident is allowed within the space at any given time.
- If a resident in supportive living does become symptomatic, they will be immediately isolated and placed on contact/droplet precautions and tested for COVID-19.
 - The resident will remain on isolation and precautions until the test results are received and the test is negative.

As a reminder, continuous masking is required within our care home when you are visiting. This includes all areas of the building and the resident room.
