We are actively preparing for our residents to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, and are coordinating a date with Alberta Health Services. Once a date is confirmed, we will let you know.

We kindly ask that all designated visitors evaluate their own need to be physically present based on the resident's needs, and then reach out to the care home to pre-schedule their visits. Of course, compassionate care visits will also continue as necessary. We appreciate your assistance in helping to keep all of our residents and employees safe.
